Photographs of events

Any photos or video taken should not be placed on any social media sites. This is an attempt to safeguard your child and any other child that may appear in the photos/videos. We thank you for your assistance with this matter.

Coming into school

It has been fantastic to see the growing confidence and independence of all those children who now come into school by themselves. The children know their morning routines well and although staff are available, few children have needed support. There are many benefits to the children coming into school by themselves: the children develop responsibility; the teachers can make a swift start to learning time; the school is a safer place as staff know exactly who is in the building and where they are. Thank you for your cooperation in this.

Children's University Passports

Please could all children bring their passports to school on Wednesday 7th December so their progress towards graduation can be monitored. Passports should be returned by the end of the week.

<u>Homework</u>

The recent parent questionnaires showed that most families are happy with the homework activities provided at Spixworth Infants. A small number of families felt there was too much homework while a few others felt there should be more, particularly for the Year 2 children. We believe that a little extra practise at home makes a real difference to children's learning at school but we recognise that families enjoy lots of other things outside of school too. We aim to help you keep this balance. Reading (and phonic practise for younger children) is vital. The homework packs we use provide a range of other activities that hopefully can be enjoyed together and will foster good attitudes and habits with regard to homework. We have also recently introduced Purple Mash where children can develop a range of computing skills at home and school and from January we will be launching an online Maths program. We hope that these extras will support you in engaging your children in learning experiences at home, making homework fun and rewarding. Please do provide us with any feedback on our new online homework activities as they are launched.

<u>Drinking water</u>

We know how important it is for children to have plenty to drink throughout the day. Although children can access their water bottles at any time we also have set times for everyone to have a drink and give reminders throughout the day. If you feel your child regularly does not drink enough, please do make the teacher or teaching assistant aware so we can monitor this more closely.
